III. WHAT’S THE SOLUTION?

Jesus Christ said, “***I AM*** the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father, except ***THROUGH ME!***”

John 14:6

God Himself came to earth as a human being to bring us back to Him. If any other way would have worked, Jesus Christ would not have had to come. The Way is a Person!

JESUS HAS ALREADY TAKEN CARE OF YOUR SIN PROBLEM!

IV. WHAT DOES GOD WANT ME TO DO?

1. _____ **THAT GOD HAS NOT BEEN FIRST PLACE IN YOUR LIFE AND ASK HIM TO FORGIVE YOUR SINS.**

“If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from every wrong.”
1 John 1:9

2. _____ **THAT JESUS DIED TO PAY FOR YOUR SINS AND THAT HE ROSE AGAIN ON EASTER AND IS ALIVE TODAY.**

*“If you confess that Jesus is your Lord and you **believe in your heart** that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.”*
Romans 10:9

3. _____ **GOD’S FREE GIFT OF SALVATION. DON’T TRY TO EARN IT.**

4. _____ **JESUS CHRIST TO COME INTO YOUR LIFE AND BE THE LORD OF YOUR LIFE.**

“To all who receive Him, He gives the right to become children of God. We need to trust Him to save us. You receive Him through obedient faith and are reborn, not physically, but spiritually by the will of God.”

“That if you confess with your mouth ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved; for with the heart man believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.”

5. YOUR OBEDIENCE TO GOD'S PLAN FOR SALVATION BY BEING IMMERSSED IN THE BIBLICAL MODE OF BAPTISM.

You can acknowledge your acceptance of these first four decisions by making the “*Good Confession*” that we find in scripture.

“I Believe”

I not only understand the Gospel Message on an intellectual level, but believe with all my heart, soul and mind and respond to it by fully committing myself as best as I can to obedience to God's word and will for my life.

“That Jesus Is The Christ”

The Messiah, the Anointed One, prophesied in Scripture to come from God to man for the purpose of fulfilling God's plan for man set before the creation of the world.

“The Son of The Living God”

That Jesus Christ was God, made flesh, fully divine, fully human, equal in deity as God the Father and the Holy Spirit.

“My Lord”

By His death, Jesus acquired a special ownership of mankind, and after His resurrection was exalted by a partnership in the divine administration.

“And Savior”

Our salvation comes through the work of Jesus Christ on the cross and our acceptance of Him, as our restoration of the severed relationship man has with God.

Baptism is part of my faith response to God.

I. WHY SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

1. TO FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE SET BY _____.

“At that time Jesus came from Nazareth and was baptized by John in the river.”

2. BECAUSE JESUS _____ IT.

*“Jesus said, ‘Go then, to all people everywhere and make them disciples, **baptize them** in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and **then teach** them to obey everything I commanded you. “*

3. IT DEMONSTRATES THAT I REALLY AM A _____.

*"...many of the people who heard Him **believed** and were **baptized**."*

II. WHAT IS THE MEANING OF BAPTISM?

1. IT ILLUSTRATES JESUS' DEATH, _____ AND RESURRECTION.

"Christ died for our sins... He was buried...and He rose again."

1 Corinthians 15:3-4

"For when you were baptized, you were buried with Christ, and in baptism you were also raised with Christ."

Colossians 2:12

"Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? [4] We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. [5] If we have been united with Him like this in His death, we will certainly also be united with Him in His resurrection. [6] For we know that our old self was crucified with Him so that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin."

Romans 6:3-6

2. IT ILLUSTRATES MY _____ AS A CHRISTIAN.

"When someone becomes a Christian he becomes a brand new person inside. The old life has passed away and a new life has begun!"

*"**By our baptism** then, we were **buried** with Him and shared His death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead... so also **we may live a new life!**"*

Baptism is not works; it is an act of faith.

IT IS THE _____ WHERE ALL OF GOD'S PROMISES ARE RECEIVED WHEN PRECEDED BY FAITH, BELIEF, REPENTANCE AND CONFESSION.

“Peter said to them, ‘each one of you must turn away from your sins and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, so that your sins will be forgiven; and you will receive God’s gift, the Holy Spirit.’”

“And those who believed Peter were baptized—about three thousand in all! They joined with the other believers in regular attendance at the apostles’ teaching sessions and at the Communion services and prayer meetings.”

And then he told them, ‘You are to go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone, everywhere. Those who believe and are baptized will be saved. But those who refuse to believe will be condemned.’”

III. WHY BE BAPTIZED BY IMMERSION?

1. BECAUSE _____ WAS BAPTIZED BY IMMERSION.

“As soon as Jesus was baptized, He went up out of the water.”

Matthew 3:16

2. EVERY BAPTISM IN THE _____ WAS BY IMMERSION.

(Example) “... then both Philip and the man went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water...”

Acts 8:38-39

3. THE WORD “BAPTIZE” MEANS TO _____ WATER.

The Greek word “**baptizo**” means “*to immerse or dip under water.*”

IT BEST SYMBOLIZES A DEATH, BURIAL AND RESURRECTION!

The founders of denominations agree:

Martin Luther (Lutheran Church)... *“I would have those who are to be baptized to be entirely immersed, as the word imports and the mystery signifies.”*

John Calvin... (Presbyterian Church) *“The word ‘baptize’ signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the ancient church.”*

John Wesley... (Methodist Church) *“Buried with Him, alludes to baptizing by immersion according to the custom of the first church.”*

Brenner (Catholic Church) *“For thirteen hundred years was baptism an immersion of the person under water.”*

IV. WHO SHOULD BE BAPTIZED?

EVERY PERSON WHO HAS _____ IN JESUS.

“Those who believed and accepted His message were baptized...” Acts 2:41

“Simon himself believed and was baptized...” Acts 8:13

“But when they believed Philip as he preached the Good News... and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women.”

Acts 8:12

At Community, we wait until our children are old enough to believe and understand the true meaning of baptism before we baptize them.

Some churches practice a “*baptism of confirmation*” for children. This ceremony is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on behalf of the child. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make their own personal confession of Christ. This custom began about 300 years after the Bible was completed.

This is different from the baptism talked about in the Bible which was only for those old enough to believe. The purpose is to publicly confess your personal commitment to Jesus Christ and be obedient to God’s plan for salvation.

At Community, it is a membership requirement that every member must have been baptized the way Jesus demonstrated, even though many of us were “confirmed” as children.

V. WHEN SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

AS SOON AS YOU HAVE BELIEVED!

*“Those who believed were baptized... **that day!**”*

Acts 2:41

“Then Philip began with the Scripture and told him the Good News about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water, and the man said, ‘Look, here is water! Why shouldn’t I be baptized right now?’ Philip said, ‘If you believe with all your heart, you may.’ The man answered, ‘I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God’ so they went down into the water and Philip baptized him.”

Acts 8:35-38

There is no reason to delay. As soon as you believe in Jesus and repent, you can and should be baptized. If you wait until you are “perfect” you’ll never be **“good enough”!**

Can my family be baptized together?

Yes, if each family member understands fully the meaning of baptism, and each one has personally placed their trust in Jesus for salvation, we encourage families to be baptized at the same time. It is a wonderful expression of commitment. Children and teenagers who wish to be baptized are asked to attend one of our age appropriate baptism classes.

However, it is important to remember that baptism is a personal statement of faith, not a family tradition. It is not wise to delay your baptism while waiting on other family members to accept Jesus, particularly children. This puts undue pressure on them and delays your obedience.

What should I wear when I am baptized?

Women and men should wear dark colored shorts. Those being baptized will receive a special baptism t-shirt to wear and keep. Bring an extra change of undergarments. Bring a plastic bag for your wet clothes and whatever other toiletries you desire. We provide changing rooms, towels and hair dryers.

Will I have to say anything?

You will be asked to repeat the “Good Confession” that *“Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God and my Lord and Savior.”* We will give you a DVD of your baptism and you will also be given a Baptismal Certificate. We encourage you to invite your relatives and friends to attend your baptism.
